- The TDSB is **revising** its Appropriate Dress Policy (P042)
- In the meantime, schools are **expected to update** their dress codes so that they align with the Board's **Equity Policy** (P037). Updated dress codes must not reflect **gender-role stereotypes** and must not be **transphobic, homophobic, racist, sexist, etc.**
- **Students should participate** in the updating of school dress codes
- Students should **never** be publicly humiliated or shamed by dress code enforcement
- Updated dress codes should be used as teaching tools for talking about **healthy relationships, boundaries, and consent**
